18 Situations that shout "Watch Out!"

- 1. Fire not scouted & sized up
- ₱2. In country not seen in daylight
- †3. Safety Zones & Escape routes not identified
- **†**4. Unfamiliar with weather and local factors influencing fire behavior
- **1**5. Uninformed on strategy, tactics and hazards
- 16. Instructions & assignments not clear
- †7. No communication link with crew members & supervisors
- *8. Constructing line without a safe anchor point
- †9. Building fireline downhill with fire below
- 110. Attempting frontal assault on fire
- 11. Unburned fuel between you and fire
- *12. Cannot see main fire, not in contact with anyone who can
- ₱13. On a hillside where rolling material can ignite fuel below
- 114. Weather is getting hotter & drier
- †15. Wind increases or changes direction
- †16. Getting frequent spot fires across the line
- †17. Terrain and fuels make escape to safety zones difficult
- †18. Taking a nap near the fireline
- **†** = Means a firefighter fatality has occurred because of this situation

10 Fire Orders

- Fight fire aggressively but provide for safety first
- Initiate all action based on current and expected fire behavior
- Recognize current weather conditions and obtain forecasts
- Ensure instructions are given and understood
- Obtain current information on fire status Remain in communication with crew
 - members, your supervisor and adjoining forces
- Determine safety zones/ escape routes
- Establish lookouts in potentially hazardous situations
- Retain control at all times

- C Communications
- E Escape Routes
- S Safety Zones
